The DEA Perspective

Program Structure

- **Mission is to provide needed medical supplies and pharmaceuticals during a public health emergency**
- **First developed to respond to a bioterrorism incident but expanded to encompass any public health emergency**
- **Federal Program with oversight by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention**

Program Structure continued

Supplies are maintained in various formats:

- 12 hour Push Packs
- Vendor Managed Inventories (VMI)
- Stockpile managed Inventories (SMI)
- CHEMPACKs



12-Hour Push Packages

**Strategically located throughout
the United States**

- **130 custom designed cargo containers**
- **Delivered anywhere in U.S. within 12 hours**
- **Delivered by ground or by air as appropriate**
- **Initial, “stop-gap” supplies intended to fill patient needs until VMI can be delivered**



Vendor Managed Inventory (VMI)

- CDC managed contracts with major manufacturers
- Manufacturers maintain stock owned by CDC for use in an emergency
- Allows for rotation of stock (maintain freshness) and decreases need for federally owned/managed storage space
- Intended to supplement Push Packs with specific medications needed to combat a specific “agent”



Stockpile Managed Inventory (SMI)

- **CDC managed stocks of medical supplies / pharmaceuticals**
- **Same purpose as VMI just different responsible parties**
- **Distributed by express carrier at the discretion of the Technical Advisory Response Unit (TARU)**
 - **TARU: Five to seven SNS program personnel who assist state and local officials with storage and distribution of supplies**



CHEMPACK

- Designed to provide first responder support in event of a nerve gas attack
- 2,300 pre-positioned packages of nerve gas antidote and controlled substances including diazepam
- Located in hospitals and emergency medical facilities for rapid access by emergency personnel
- Maintained by SNS program personnel



Impact on DEA

Exceptions granted under 21 CFR § 1307.03

- **Registration:** State stockpile program participants must register as distributors
- **Security:** Storage containers meet requirements for Schedule IV controlled substances
 - Exemption has been granted to allow commingling of controlled substances with other medical supplies



Impact on DEA continued

Recordkeeping

- **Order forms:** Shipping is restricted to the address printed on the order form. In the event of a public health emergency, this requirement is waived to allow shipment where needed.
- **DEA can now issue a Disaster DEA # for suppliers to use to process Order Forms.**
- **Inventory:** The maintaining registrant will act as custodial registrant and be responsible for appropriate inventories of controlled substances.



Impact on DEA continued

- **Oversight of SNS programs must be in compliance with DEA regulations to the fullest extent possible**
 - However, under no circumstances should DEA regulations be a roadblock to the rapid distribution and dispensing of needed drugs
- **DEA's mission is to protect the public health and safety**
 - Ensuring that the necessary pharmaceuticals are available to treat the U.S. populace in the event of a national emergency is an agency priority




