


Unintentional drug poisoning deaths by year and drug type, Oregon, 2000 to 2011


Percentage of prescription opioid-related deaths by age group, Oregon, 2007-2011

Percentage of total deaths





Frequency and percent of unintentional drug overdose deaths from more than one drug, OR, 2007-2011



Number of people/1,000 residents receiving an opioid, Oregon, 10/1/2011 to 3/31/2012




Number of people/1,000 residents receiving an opioid and benzo, Oregon, 10/1/2011 to 3/31/2012

Who is most at risk?

A CDC policy impact report cites the following indicators for people at highest risk for prescription painkiller overdose:

- Take high doses of prescription painkillers
- Have low incomes
- Live in rural areas
- Have a history of mental illness
- Have a history of substance misuse

What is a PDMP?


- A queryable electronic database that contains a set of information on all controlled substance prescriptions dispensed to patients in Oregon.
- The PDMP patient report is a line list of every controlled substance prescription dispensed.

 - Other state PDMP Programs

Unintentional drug poisoning deaths by year and drug type, Oregon, 2000 to 2011





- Senator Bill Fisher, Roseburg
- Opposition: Rep. John Minnis, ACLU, OMA
- Support: OSPA
- Died in committee

July 2004:

- OBOP wins Harold Rodgers Grant \$350,000
- Allocation contingent on passage of legislation
- \$50,000 allocated for planning activities

2005 Legislature:


- SB 180, BOP Agency Bill
- Opposed: ACLU, OMA, OPMC, Sen. Morrisette
- Support: OSPA ONA, ODA, ONDCP, MD's
- Testimony by ID and NV PDMP directors and ONDCP Dep. Asst. Dir.

PDMP History

2005 Legislature:

- SB 1093, OBOP and Sens. Kruse & Gordly
- End of session revival after SB 180 died
- Attempt to salvage program & grant funds
- Died in committee without a hearing
- BOP applied and awarded grant extension (One year)

Unintentional drug poisoning deaths by year and drug type, Oregon, 2000 to 2011





PDMP History

2007 Legislature:

- SB 34, OBOP and Sen. Bill Morrisette
- Opposition: ACLU, OMA
- Support: everybody else (Oregon vs John Ashcroft DWD suit settled)
- Passed Senate, died in Ways & Means
- BOP Grant extended for another year

Unintentional drug poisoning deaths by year and drug type, Oregon, 2000 to 2011





- SB 355 OBOP
- Opposition: Solo ACLU
- Support: OMA OPMC, legislators & Docs
- Major changes to security & access
- PASSED: Program established in OHA

Purposes of prescription monitoring

- Support access to legitimate medical use of controlled substances
- Identify and deter or prevent drug abuse and diversion

Purposes of prescription monitoring

- Facilitate and encourage the identification, intervention and treatment of persons addicted to prescription drugs
- Inform public health initiatives through outlining use and abuse trends
- Educate individuals about PDMPs and the use, abuse and diversion of and addiction to prescription drugs

About Oregon's PDMP

- Operated and maintained by the Oregon Health Authority (OHA)
- Established in statute in 2009:
ORS 431.962 - 431.978 & 431.992
- Data are protected health information
- System is Web-based and access is limited

PDMP Basics

- Pharmacies began uploading Schedules II-IV controlled substances on June 1, 2011
- Online system went live on September 1, 2011 and is accessible 24/7
- Data are destroyed after 3 years

System use is voluntary

- The law does not require a healthcare providers to use the system
- Healthcare providers who do not use the system are protected from liability by statute

Oregon PDMP collects pharmacy data

Patient information

- First and last names, middle initial
- Date of birth
- Address
- Drug code number
- Date drug was prescribed
- Date drug was dispensed
- Quantity of drug dispensed

Pharmacy and practitioner information

- Dispensing pharmacy
- Prescriber

Who reports?

Retail pharmacies licensed by the Oregon Board of Pharmacy are required to report data within one week after dispensing a controlled Substance prescription.

Pharmacies dispensing in the state and pharmacies located outside the state dispensing to Oregon residents.

Who may have access?

- Licensed healthcare providers (Practitioners Pharmacists) authorized by the OHA
- PDMP staff to administer the program
- Vendor personnel contracted to maintain the system

Others who may request PDMP information

- Patients may obtain a free copy of their record
- Regulatory boards may request information on a licensee if they certify it is necessary for an active investigation
- Law enforcement agencies may request information on an individual pursuant to a valid court order based on probable cause

Recent Legislative Update

- Additional data points (pt. gender, days supply, refill data)
- Permits a prescriber & pharmacist to delegate access to members of staff
- Permits a prescriber to review prescriptions dispensed under their own DEA number
- Allows the State Medical Examiner to access PDMP data for autopsies and death investigations
- Authorizes prescribers in neighboring states who treat Oregonians to access the Oregon PDMP
- Allows public health authorities to use de-identified PDMP data
- Protects PDMP data from potential public records requests

Oregon Prescription Drug Monitoring Program

This new program called the Oregon Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (PDMP) will help healthcare providers and pharmacists provide patients better care in managing their prescriptions. They will now have more complete information to help assure appropriate use of certain prescribed medications.

On June 1, 2011 pharmacies began submitting data for the program for *Schedules II, III and IV controlled substances* dispensed to patients. The protected health information will be collected and stored securely. Unauthorized people cannot access individuals' personal prescription records.

On September 1, 2011 the PDMP system will go online. Healthcare providers and pharmacists will then be able to apply online for an account. Once approved, they may begin accessing information from the system via the Web for patients under their care.

The program was started to help people work with their healthcare providers and pharmacists to know what medications are best for them. The information will support the appropriate use of prescription drugs.

OHA grants PDMP system accounts to Oregon-licensed healthcare providers and pharmacists so that they may look up controlled substance information on their own patients via the Web using a user name and password.

Healthcare providers and pharmacists must apply to the PDMP for a user account to access information from the system—see instructions below. Access is granted to individuals only—not to clinics, hospitals, pharmacies or any other health care facility.

Starting in mid-September the PDMP will be employing Outreach Specialists stationed throughout the state to promote the use of the system. If you would like to talk with an Outreach Specialist or have one come speak to a group, email pdmp.health@state.or.us or call 971-673-0741.

PDMP Account Request Procedure

Healthcare providers and pharmacists must perform the following steps to request an account:

1. Click the [Terms & Conditions](#) link located on the left menu to open and read.
2. After reading the Terms and Conditions, click the [Access Request Site](#) link on the left menu. A logon window is displayed.
3. Type *newacct* in the User name field.
4. Type *welcome* in the Password field.
5. Click OK.
6. Complete the fields on this form, noting that required fields are indicated with an asterisk (*).
7. Click Submit.

If all information has been properly supplied, a completed Access Request Form is displayed, along with a prompt to print the form.

If information is incomplete or missing, a message is displayed indicating which fields must be corrected before your Access Request Form can be submitted.

8. Print a hard copy of the completed Account Request Form.
9. Sign the printed Account Request Form and have it notarized.



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
