


Patrol Robbery Response

During the first six months of 2014, 45 business robberies (not including bank robbery) were recorded in Versadex. Chart 1 shows the overall numbers, plus the six-month breakdown by NCIC code for 2012-2014.




Chart 2 outlines the location types most commonly associated with business robberies in 2014. These six location types account for 38 of the 45 business robberies committed, or 84.4%.




Chart 3 shows business robberies by the day of the week they were committed. Tuesday was the most common day during the first half of 2014, followed by Friday





Chart 4 shows the hour of the day when business robberies were committed. The highest counts overall was the three-hour period from 2100 to 2400.



The Crime Scene

- Locate and secure the Scene so it can be processed.
- If possible find a route in and out of the scene that does not lead to evidence contamination.
- Help identify location where prints, blood, DNA evidence may be found.
- Remember the scene will be photographed please don't touch or move anything

What Questions Will Be Asked

- Accurate description.
- M/F , Race, Age Height and Weight, Hair and Eye color?
- Scars or tattoos.
- Tone of voice, accent.
- What were you doing when you first observes suspect?
- What did he first say?
- How was robbery announced?
- Where you afraid?
- What was the suspects show of force?
- What was taken? As precise as possible.
- Where did you last see the suspect?

Back-up Officers

- Check the area surrounding the robbery for witnesses and video or any other evidence.
- Canvas the flight path.
- Canvas the secondary scene for witness and video Canvas of the area is important.

Locating the Suspect



Preventative Measures

- Security Cameras-High resolution for both day and night/interior/exterior
- Visible security
- Lighting for parking lot
- Windows and doors should be unobstructed
- Alarm systems/panic
- Service Counter away from escape route
- GPS?

Pharmacy Robbery

- When did you first observe suspect?
- Determine the manner of robbery: note job, verbal demand, take over.
- what was the verbiage? What did suspect say or what did the note say
- Did suspect ask for specific medication?
- Bait money, dye pack, GPS tracker given?

Pharmacy Robbery

- Was suspect Familiar? Suspect been in before or customer
- Can victim ID suspect?
- What was taken?
- If there video of the incident?
- Are prints possible?

- Stay Calm
- Cooperate With Suspect

- Make Sure All Employees Understand
