ARCOS Reporting: Who Reports To ARCOS?



- Manufacturers, Distributors, & Reverse Distributors
 - ❖ Note: Per 21 U.S.C. § 802(15), this includes re-packagers & re-labelers
- Increases & decreases to inventory are reported from the perspective of these registrations

ARCOS Reporting: Who Reports To ARCOS?



If a company has any other types of registrations, transactions would <u>not</u> be reported under those registrations



What Is Reported To ARCOS?



In general, any increases and decreases to inventory of ARCOS reportable drugs, along with endof-year inventory and certain manufacturing activities



- Increases to inventory include ...
 - ✓ Purchases/Receipt of supply
 - Returns from customers
 - ✓ Returns from Gov't or law enforcement
 - ✓ Received for the purpose of destruction



- **❖** Decreases to inventory include ...
 - ✓ Sales/transfer of supply
 - ✓ Thefts, losses, spillage
 - ✓ Destruction
 - ✓ Seizure/receipt by Gov't



- ❖ Manufacturing activities (examples) ...
 - ✓ Material manufactured
 - ✓ Use of material to create a preparation in another schedule
 - ✓ Waste recovered from manufacturing
 - ✓ Stability or quality testing



- End of year reportable inventory ...
 - ✓ ARCOS reportable substances and products only
 - ✓ Snapshot of what was on-hand at close of business December 31st



- Inventory resulting from a schedule change ...
 - ✓ Limited situations; drug not previously reportable to ARCOS becomes reportable



- * ARCOS reportable drugs are ...
 - ✓ All Schedule 1 controlled substances
 - ✓ All Schedule 2 controlled substances
 - ✓ Schedule 3 narcotics and GHB preps
 - ✓ Selected Schedule 3 and 4 psychotropics, for which manufacturing must be reported (21 C.F.R. § 1304.33(d))



How To Report To ARCOS



- Electronic reporting is mandatory, per the SUPPORT Act (2018)

ARCOS Online Reporting System

Electronic Data Interchange (EDI)





- ✓ Web interface user friendly
- ✓ Transactions validated up front
- ✓ Account management; additional users
- ✓ Error corrections
- ✓ No formatting worries; "buttons"



- Electronic Data Interchange (EDI)
 - ✓ Better for larger volume
 - ✓ Automated uploads (allowed, not supported)
 - ✓ Limited users one login
 - ✓ Error notifications after processing
 - ✓ Importance of proper formatting



Common Issues



Uncorrected Error Transactions

- ✓ Transaction data is not reflected in ARCOS
- ✓ Can be accessed and addressed at any time in the ARCOS Online system
- ✓ Ability to delete if uncorrectable
- ✓ Should not occur if using ARCOS Online to file reports, with few exceptions



National Drug Codes (NDCs)

- ✓ NDCs ending in -00 to -99 represent finished package sizes; Quantity should represent number of packages
- ✓ NDCs ending in -** represent bulk dosage form, bulk material, or bulk liquid; Quantity represents number of units, with Unit and Strength for bulk material and liquid



Strength Field

- ✓ Required for bulk raw materials and bulk liquid products; reflects purity
- ✓ For finished package NDCs, can be used with Quantity of 1 package to report a partial or combined package
- ✓ Implied decimal after 3rd digit ("1000" is 100%, "0100" is 10%, "0010" is 1%, and "0001" is 0.1%)



Destructions

- ✓ Reported by registration under which destruction occurs
- ✓ Transfers to Reverse Distributors are reported as sales (Code "S")
- ✓ Registration number of local DEA office is still required in Associate Registrant field



Inventory

- ✓ Unless a substance becomes ARCOS reportable during the year and an "initial inventory" of that drug is required, the only inventory reported to ARCOS is end-of-year
- ✓ End-of-year inventory is separate from YERS (Quota) and should be included in the 4th quarter or December ARCOS submission



No Activity/No Inventory

- ✓ Trans Code "7" is required when there is no ARCOS reportable activity during any reporting period
- ✓ Trans Code "8" is required when there is no ARCOS reportable inventory on hand at close of business December 31st



Non-controlled or Non-reportable

- ✓ Non-controlled substances should never be reported to ARCOS; errors will result
- ✓ It is best not to include non-reportable substances, such as C-III non-narcotics, C-IV, and C-V controlled substances; errors will result if the product is not in our dictionary



Proof of Processing

- ✓ EDI upload confirmation is not confirmation that the report was successfully processed; formatting issues not considered
- ✓ Email received from our Unit and confirmation in ARCOS Online are proof that the report has been processed
